

GENERAL STATEMENT OF POSITION:

Reunification Home Nurse position provides a combination of duties to ensure that the family has health and medical supports in place to support their health and well-being. The Nurse is responsible for determining on-going health and medical supports of the family to determine what is required for their health and well-being. Generally performs on-going physical assessments of families along with consultation between the Caseworker, Elders, Mental Health Therapist and family as well as other significant persons involved in the family's life. Work with families to address their health issues to improve their physical health within a trauma informed framework and integrating a client centered and strength-based approach. The Nurse is to work in collaboration with Elders to ensure that the families have access to Siksika culture and traditions while on their healing journey.

Duties & Responsibilities:

- Works collaboratively in consultation with Caseworkers, Mental Health Therapist and Elders on all activities, duties and responsibilities relating to health and well-being of families
- Documentation of outreach activities and provide medical knowledge to families
- Ability to work with families and manage health situations
- Provide health and medical options to families
- Knowledge of physical/mental health disorders and substance abuse disorders and specific attention to characteristics and behaviors of individuals. Knowledge of drug/alcohol services and programs and advocate for families within the medical framework.
- Work within a multidisciplinary team to assist parents with Treatment Services as required
- Responsible for arranging specialist consultations and follow through.
- Provide relevant health and medical wrap around services to support families.
- Work with Elders to provide culturally relevant supports to families
- Ensures all financial costs associated with health and medical needs are addressed (i.e., Medical notes required by Doctors for Treatment)
- Liaises with related health professionals such as City of Calgary Police/RCMP, Doctors, Hospitals, Justice/Court, PDD, AISH, Office of Public Guardian and Trustee, Education and all Siksika community services that families are utilizing services from.
- Works within a multidisciplinary team to get information to Professionals to ensure Mental Health, FASD, Psychological, Parenting and/or Cognitive Assessments or any assessments required are completed for families
- Maintains confidentiality
- Use Siksika Nation member's professional service providers, whenever possible.
- Remain current with professional association
